PAP English I Final Book Study Project Due Date: Monday, May 17th

Overview

You will be creating a reflective project about a book you've read. Because it is reflective, you will be required to think both analytically and metacognitively in order to create a <u>Google</u> <u>Slideshow presentation</u> of this book. That means this project will be unique to *your understanding* of the book you chose.

Requirements

How you choose to organize your slideshow is entirely up to you. This means that you are in charge of choosing the style, color, length, and order in which you present these requirements. You are expected to make this look as professionally created as possible. Consider using a template from <u>SlidesGo</u> to make your presentation pop! Your slideshow <u>must include</u> the following criteria:

- Title of the book
- Author's name
- 1. Brief description the context of the book (time and place in which the content inside of the book takes place)
- 2. 5 stand-out quotes with a brief explanation for why they stand out to you
- 3. 3 stand-out scenes/events in the book (with a brief description of each scene/event), with a word cloud of at least 6 associated mood words that you come up with to describe the scene
- 4. 2 songs (with video/video clips of the songs embedded in the slide) that you associate with the tone OR mood OR theme in the book. Be sure to include a brief description of the tone OR mood OR theme in the book and why you think it connects to the song. Include quotes from both the song and the book in each description.
- 5. 1 TEDTalk video (with a link to the video) that connects to a theme/event in your book and a brief description of why you think it connects. Include quotes from both the book and the video in your description.
- 6. 1 character connection describing how/why you personally connect with a character/person in the book
- 7. 1 character disconnect describing how/why you personally cannot relate to a character/person in the book

Be sure to *make it clear which requirement you are referring to on each slide* so that (1), I can check off the requirement easily during grading, and (2) I can see your presentation is neatly organized. *Organization counts!*
